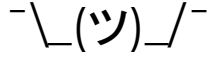
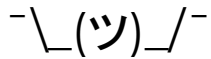

- Institutional Repository
 - Islandora
- Journal publishing
 - OJS (Florida OJ)
- Open textbooks
 - 
- Digital Editions
 -  (...again)
- Data
 - OSF, Islandora (in progress)

2011

- Nascent ScholComm movement
- No development staff
- Push for OA initiative
- Tenuous budget support

Digital Commons = IR & Journals

2014

- Growth of OA/ScholComm
 - +1 developer
- Issues w/ bepress
 - Community feature requests?
- Opportunity: Consortium
 - Islandora Scholar

2015

- Migration project begins in earnest
 - Can we replace Digital Commons 1:1?
- Timelines
 - Transform records in early 2015
 - Fall 2015 “soft” launch
 - Full switchover early 2016
 - Journal editor switchover?



Migration - not easy

- Transforming ~10,000 records
 - Mapping metadata transformations
 - Bepress to MODS
 - Time for enhancements & quality control
- Recognizing new workflows
- Negotiating migration of journals
 - Law Library's decision

2016

- Migration complete on Jan. 6
- OA Policy passed Feb. 17
 - Massive spike in faculty submissions
 - Now ~150/month from ~100/year before
- Development of DigiNole's features continue
 - Getting lots of feedback for future features
 - Transparent development process

2017

- Success of OA policy = visibility of Open on campus
- Digital Pedagogy
 - OER push!
 - Integrating IR into LibPub options

Now

- Continuation of highly-successful OA and OER initiatives
- Robust ScholComm services
- Exploring new LibPub avenues:
 - Data
 - Monographs?
 - Digital Editions?
 - Digital Humanities projects?
