Our initial plan was an interactive, collaborative experimental session with folks gathered in person around tables, having discussions

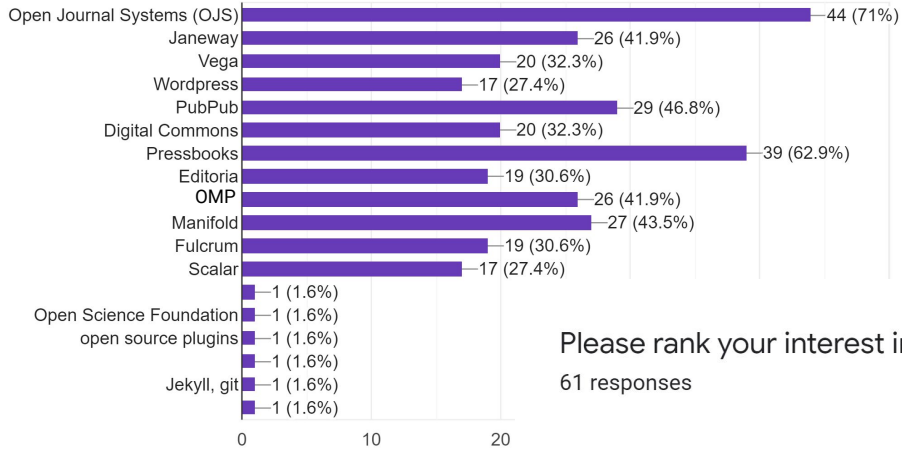

# Pre-Forum Survey Data and Discussion

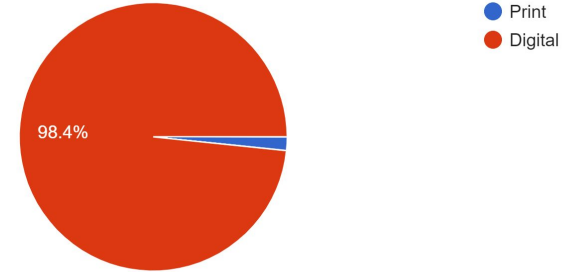
What softwares/platforms are you interested in? (Check all that apply.)

62 responses



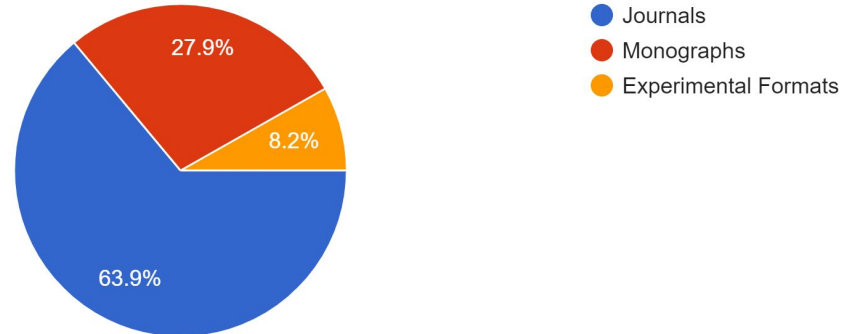
Are you more interested in print or digital outputs?
