

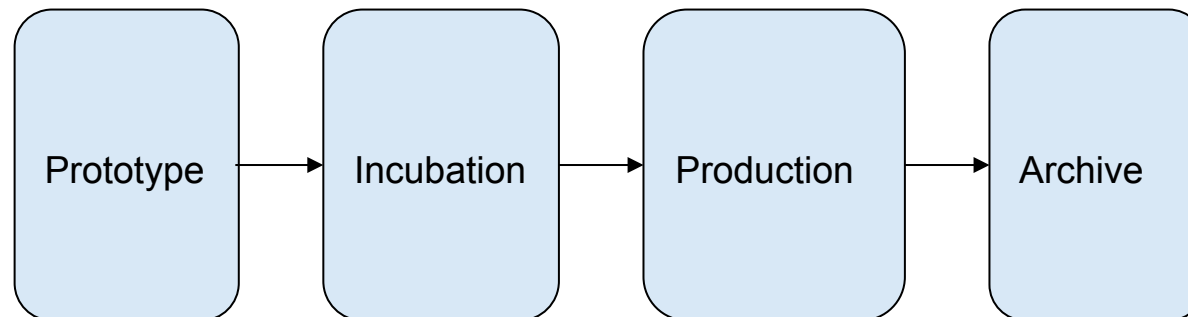

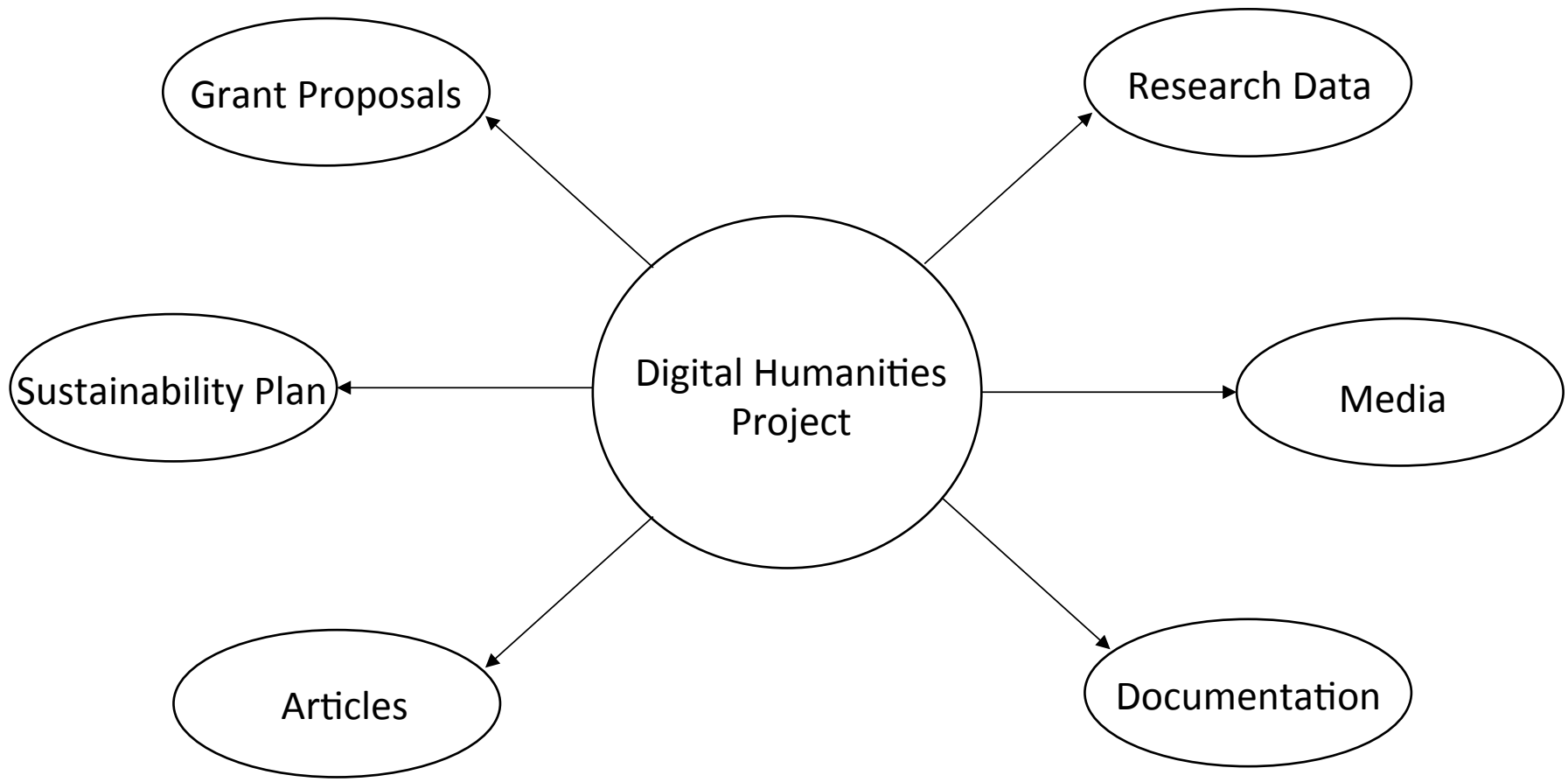


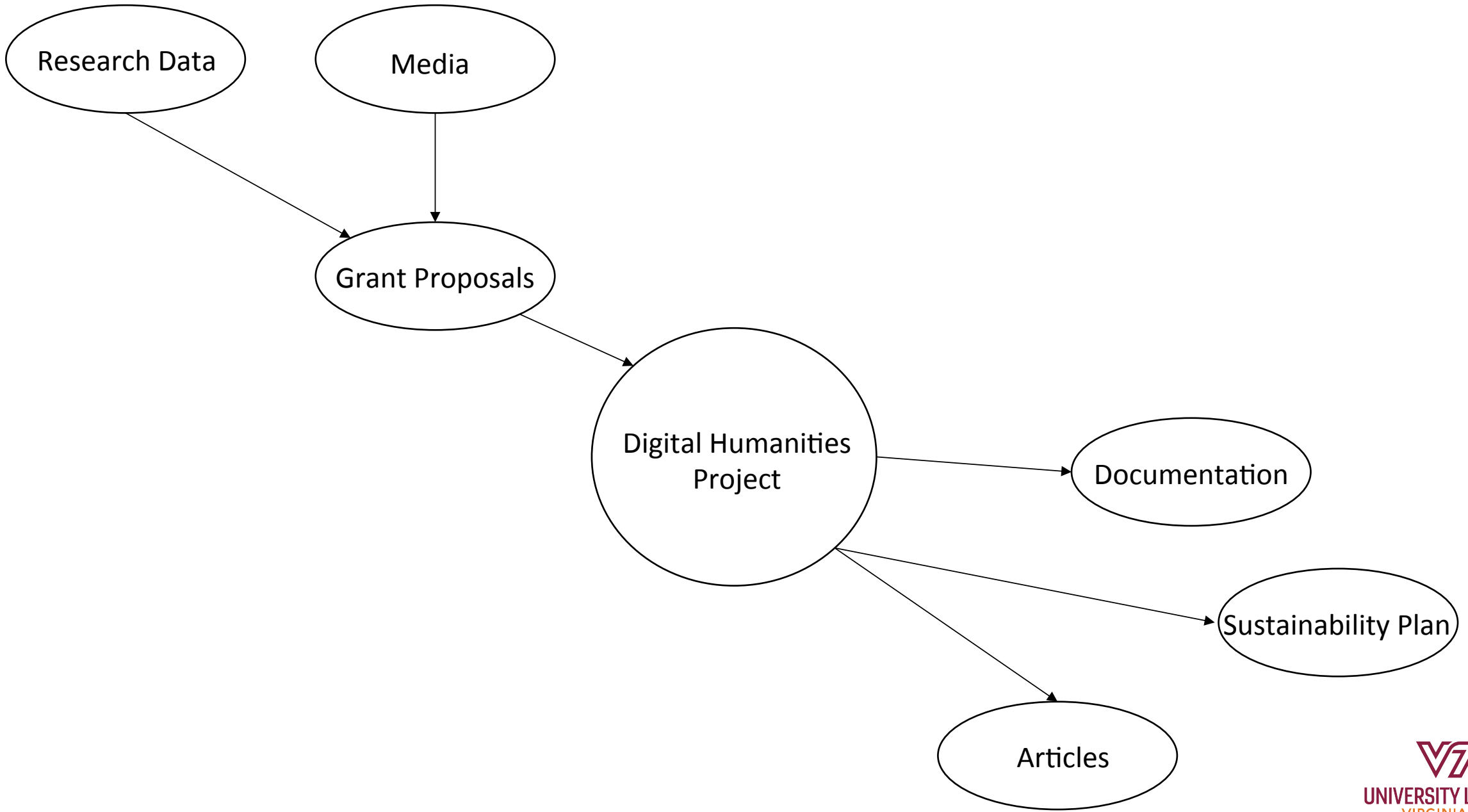
# DH Project Time Frame

- Large projects can take years
  - NEH DH Advancement grants are typically for 24-36 months<sup>1</sup>
  - ACLS Digital Advancement grants for 12-18 months<sup>2</sup>
- Multiple phases within a projects lifetime

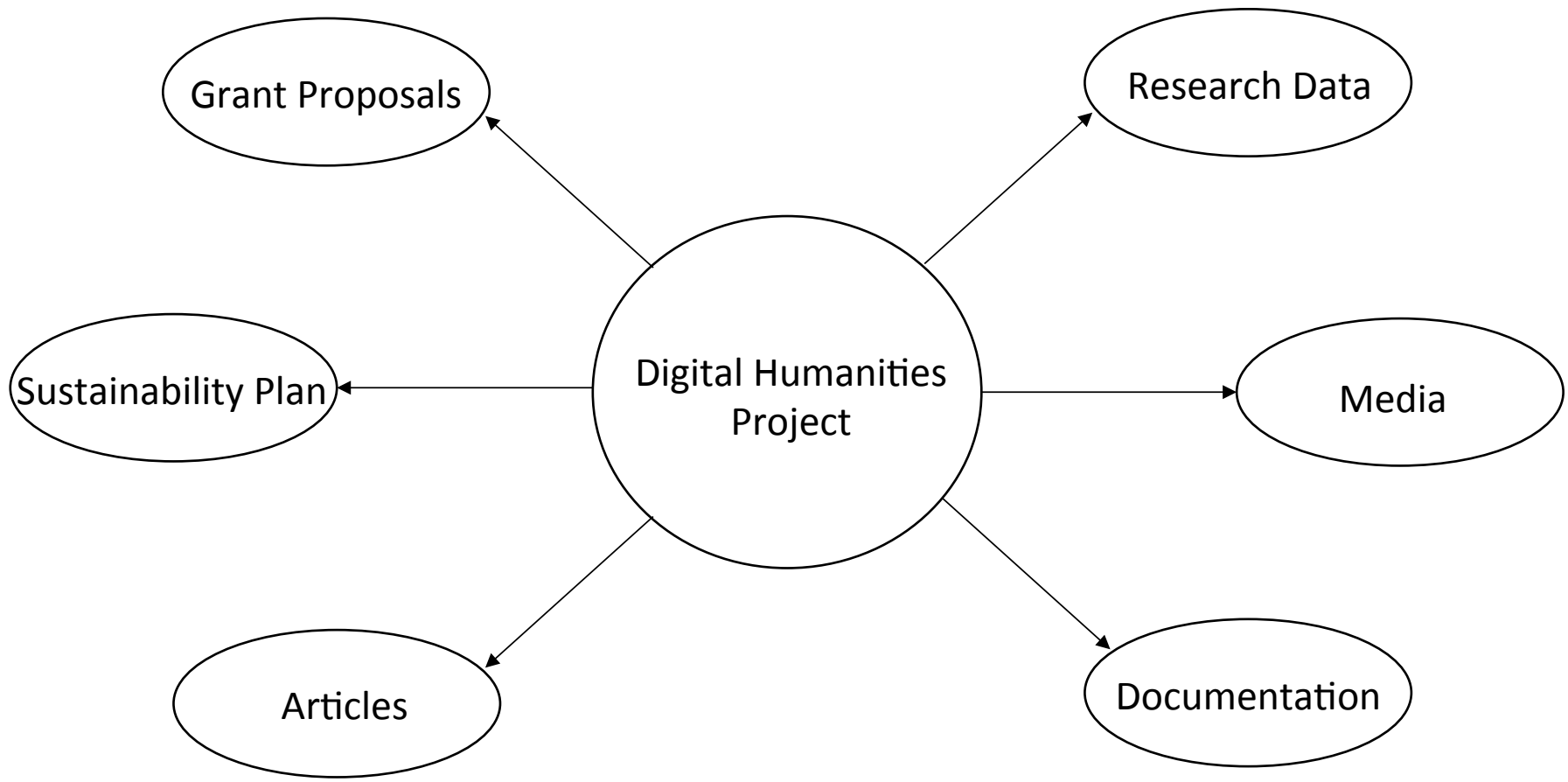

# But Why do This?

- Ensure that the data and information is publicly available
- Make the work reproducible
- Encourage different levels of preservation
- Provide the researchers involved in the project the credit for years of labor – more so than one line on their CV

# Current Test Case

- Social Networks in Georgian Britain (SNiGB)
- Built from previous project, Lord Byron and his Times ([lordbyron.org](http://lordbyron.org))
- 30,000 individual records collected over the past couple of decades

# SNiGB

- Ultimate Goal: Build an interactive social network that will allow users explore the data in both its raw XML format as well as through visualizations in a user interface
- Short term Goal: Publish the raw XML files in a public Git Repository
