




# What is Library Publishing?

Library publishing is the activities of academic libraries to support the creation, dissemination, and curation of scholarly, creative, or educational works.

Library publishing often requires a production process, presents original work not previously made available, and certifies the content, whether through peer review or branding.

It is distinguished from traditional publishing by preferring Open Access, informal and experimental forms of scholarly communication, and challenging the status quo.


