

Case Studies in Collaboration

North Broad Press, a joint imprint from Temple University Press and the Temple University Library that publishes peer-reviewed open textbooks by Temple faculty.

Trailblazers, a new open access initiative from Liverpool University Press that champions the often overlooked early-career researcher. Run in partnership with Lancaster University, University of Liverpool, and University of Salford (UK).

Brown University Digital Publications, a Library-based born-digital publishing program that offers training workshops for HBCU scholars and library professionals seeking to gain expertise in developing open access born-digital scholarship.



Lessons





What We Learned

- Created a program that isn't scalable
 - Launched in better budgetary times, with additional FTE
 - Platinum-level service
 - RFPs on hold since 2019
 - Finite amount of annual funding under threat
- Service tiers/support levels?
- Modify production process?
- Valuable window into teaching and learning; opportunity to be involved in creation of pedagogy

WHAT IS TRAILBLAZERS?

- Trailblazers is a new open access initiative for Early Career Researchers (ECRs) within the humanities and social sciences.
- ➤ It is built on collaboration and knowledge-sharing between several leading UK institutions and Liverpool University Press.
- Libraries pay a heavily discounted Book Processing Charge for each monograph. LUP covers the difference.
- ➤ ECRs often need a first book contracted for tenure or inclusion in the UK's Research Excellence Framework (REF).

What is an **Early Career Researcher?**

- A researcher within **eight years** of their PhD award or equivalent professional training.
- ➤ Or within **six years** of their first academic appointment (the first full or part time paid employment contract that lists research or teaching as the primary function).


























